A Brief history of The Lafayette Inn



THE LAFAYETTE IS a Federal-style three story building built in 1840 by Robert Pritchett. Its walls, three layers of brick thick, surround a large central hall and stairway, with rooms on either side. In the earliest days the Tavern Room may have been a company store room, where merchandise was sold or bartered. The dining room being (still) located across the hall. There was a ballroom on the second floor, and the third floor was apparently the families living quarters. The hotel was heated by twelve fireplaces, four on each floor. The annex, at the southwest corner, may have been the earliest building on the lot, constructed to house some of those who worked

on the hotel. The complex includes “Dicey’s Cottage” known for years as simply the “Slaves Quarters”.

In April of 1862 General Stonewall Jackson ordered an 8,500-man division into Greene County. Many men became sick, probably with typhoid fever. The sick men were treated in temporary hospitals, surely including The Lafayette. In the following century plus, the Inn has seen several uses but usually returning to its roots of being a destination location.

In early 2005, the Lafayette Inn was bought by Alan and Kaye Pyles. The Lafayette Inn has already earned numerous awards for the inn restaurant and overall wine business.
